Getting there Traveling by car is the only practical way to get to Yuelarbah car park (gps: -32.9621, 151.7198). Car: There is free parking available.

0 | Yuelarbah car park

Yuelarbah car park on Burwood Rd, Kahibah is the starting point to a number of walking and MTB tracks within the Glenrock State Conservation Area. There is a sheltered information sign with historical and natural heritage information. There are about 25 parking bays, and a mobility parking bay.

0 | Yuelarbah car park

(580 m 12 mins) From the Yuelarbah car park, this walk follows the 'Yuelarbah walking track' sign down along the sealed footpath, between the timber bollards. The footpath has a handrail on each side and initally zig zags downhill before joining the timber boardwalk. The elevated boardwalk has (1m high) handrails and leads through the bush for just shy of 100m, where there is a small step down on to the gravel track. The walk continues gently downhill along the wide gravel track for 100m to pass a faint rough track (on the left, that leads to a picnic table). This walk stays on the main wide path as is gently undulates mostly dowhill for another 400m, then coming to a 3-way intersection, marked with a 'Yuelarbah Track' sign (and track on the right) just before a large foot bridge.

0.58 \mid Int of Yuelarbah track & Glenrock scoutcamp track

(40 m 1 mins) Continue straight: From the intersection, this walk follows the 'Yuelarbah Track' sign down and across the large foot suspension bridge, over Flaggy Creek. On the other side of the bridge, this walk leads gently up to a T-

intersection with a wide track.

0.62 | Int of Yuelarbah & Flaggy Creek tracks

(40 m 1 mins) Turn left: From the intersection, this walk follows the wide gravel track towards the yellow and black sign in the distance, keeping the creek down to the left. The track leads over a gentle rise then down to a concrete platform with two picnic tables.

0.66 | Flaggy Creek picnic area

The Flaggy Creek picnic area, is an unsignposted picnic area on the northern side of Flaggy Creek, near the suspension bridge. There are two picnic tables on a large concrete slab. There is a rough track that leads down to the cascades on the creek. There is also a warning sign saying that the creek water may be contaminated from sewerage overflow and swimming is not advised.. It is, however, a very pleasant spot to enjoy the quiet and peacefull valley.

Seats: There are 2 seats on this walk. They are 640m apart.


Surface

Mostly 1.5m wide and on compacted gravel track. The first 30m follows an asphalt path. About 100m is on timber boardwalk.

Steepness


Mostly gentle slope downhill towards the picnic area. The return is uphill. Early in the walk is a 30m moderately steep section on asphalt.

Parking Accessible (0m)

There are about 25 car parking bays. One is a marked mobility parking bay at the eastern end. The mobility parking area is asphalt, 3.2m wide and 4m deep, with extra 1.5m space beside the parking bay.



Trip Hazard (110m)

Between the gravel path and timber boardwalk is a 5cm step, 1.5m wide.



5 Picnic Table (640m)

Two timber slat picnic tables with bench seats. The tables are 79cm high, 93cm deep and 2.1m wide. The seats are 44cm high, 30cm deep and 2.1m wide (no backrest). The tables are on a large paved flat area.



Pinch Point

Timber bollard pinch points around the edge of car park. The gap between the bollard are 1m, they are 70cm high.



Picnic Table (230m)

A timber slat picnic table and bench seat. The table is 85cm high, 75cm deep and 2.1m wide. The seats are 54cm high, 29cm deep and 2.1m wide (no backrest). The seat is found about 10m down a rough track (with 13cm step), from the main path.
